Year 5 & 6 have the option to attend two 5 day residential experiences (Wales & Scotland) where they have the opportunity to broaden their knowledge from KS1, through first-hand experiences, of the UK. For many of our children, these experiences also provide their first experience of travelling by train, ferry and plane.

We also have links with the British Language School in Bury St Edmunds and annually welcome children from an international school in Spain (Spanish, French, German, Dutch, Canadian & Italian). From time to time, we also welcome children from a school in Thailand and schools from China.
